


Weekly Discussion Guide

"Religious Science is not a personal opinion, nor is it a special revelation. It is a result of the best thought of the ages. It borrows much of its light from others but, in so doing, robs no one, for Truth is universal." Dr. Ernest Holmes.

Religious Science can be viewed as a teaching of diversity and inclusion, because in embraces all paths and has even used the teachings to assist all people in bettering their lives and the lives of others. Holmes writes. "Taking the best from all sources, Religious Science has access to the highest enlightenment of the ages. Religious Science reads every man's bible and gleans the truths therein contained." To do this, Holmes had to let go of any judgment in order to find, see and then practice the Truth that was revealed to him. He put it this way. "Without criticism, without judgment but by true discrimination, that which is true and provable may be discovered and put to practical use." Again, diversity and inclusion, but at a deeper level.

Everyone searches for the Truth. There is something within us that urges us to look for that Something. Dr. Holmes writes, "What is the Truth? Where may it be found? And how used? These are the questions that an intelligent person asks." Then he makes what may be considered a bold statement when he says, "He finds his answer in the study of Religious Science. Shorn of dogmatism, freed from superstition and always ready for greater illumination, Religious Science offers the student of life the best that the world has so far discovered."

When we get past the dogma and superstitions of religions, we find that they point to the same thing. There is One power and presence. Yes, that one may appear as the many. But these are different attributes of the One. Holmes writes. "There is One Reality at the heart of all religions whether the name be Hindu, Muslim, Christian or Jewish."

You may have heard some people say that they were spiritual, not religious. You may feel the same way. Religions, it has been said, can be a gateway to spirituality. Many of us have come to the spiritual path because our respective religions no longer served us or answered the deeper call of our soul. Religious Science is a way in which we can start to experience the answers to that calling.

The Purpose of Religious Science

We all want to live a life that is free of strife. We all want to live a life that is creative, prosperous and joy-filled. Religious Science can provide these things. Here is Holmes. "In its practice and teachings, Religious Science endeavors to include the whole life. It is not a dreamy, mystical cult but the exponent of a vigorous gospel, applicable to the everyday needs of our common life." As with anything we want to embody, it takes practice, it takes doing the work. However, this work is so worth it. As Holmes stated above, 'It is applicable to the everyday needs of our common life.'

Dr. Holmes has a different view on the word religion in regard to Religious Science. He writes, "Religion, it (Religious Science) says, if it means anything, means right living and right thinking — and right thinking waits on no future but bestows rewards in this life: in better health, happier homes and all that makes for a well-balanced, normal life."

You will find scripture saying the same thing. Jesus said in speaking from the I Am, which you are; 'I Am come that you may have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.' John 10:10.

Statement of Belief

We read in the bible and it is alluded to in other scriptures from around the world that our belief is powerful. An example of this is, 'It is done unto you as you believe.' Following is, as Holmes states, a brief Statement of Belief of the Institute of Religious Science: **The Universe is fundamentally good.**

We are surrounded by good. To experience this, we must first believe this to be true. It is from this belief that we will start to recognize the all good of the Universe. As we embody this Truth, we may, Holmes points out, "be certain that the Spirit of Life is for and not against us."

This teaching, this way of life is remarkable, when we put it to use. Holmes elucidated for all of us that 'There is a power in the Universe greater that we are, and we can us It.' Religious Science provides the practical tools for us to live the life we came to live.

Let's commit or re-commit to allowing that Universal Presence to flow through us so powerfully that we too can say as Jesus said; 'when you see me, you see the Power and the Presence that sent me.'
